Here's the good news, Father Peyton also said, "If families give Our Lady 15 minutes a day by reciting the Rosary, I assure them that their homes will become, by God's grace, peaceful places." Let's make a clear choice to pray as a Family at a specific time every day. This daily prayer is essential for deepening our Family's joy, faith, hope, and love.

A good way to rethink Family prayer is to place Christ at the center of your Family life rather than trying to squeeze Him in among the gaps in your busy schedule. "Christ is the Center of this Family." We see these very words on plaques in many homes. Remember, if you include your prayer as an afterthought to "more important" activities in your schedule, your prayer will become perfunctory, dry and dull. Invariably this leads to abandoning prayer altogether. However, when you fully integrate prayer into every aspect of family life, everything the Family does becomes prayerful. This includes playing, praying, working, and talk-ing. All of these will be filled with God's love and become acts of prayer. Before you know it, your Family will be fully alive as a Domestic Church.

Family Activities

Create a "prayer corner" in the home if you don't have one. Along with the Bible, Rosaries, and prayerbooks, place a statue or picture of the patron saint of your children with a candle in front of it. Encourage children

to learn about their Patron Saints and pray through their intercession. It is helpful to invite the children to light the candle as a sign that the Family is at prayer.

Another practical way to enrich the prayer experience for the whole family involves a Prayer Pilgrimage through the house while praying the Rosary. For example, the Rosary might begin at the "prayer corner" in the living room with the Sign of the Cross, Apostles Creed, Our Father, Three Hail Marys and Glory Be. This introduction might be led by the parents or an adult guest. Then the family moves to the Kitchen for the First Decade of the Rosary led by the Mother, to the Playroom or Den for the Second Decade led by one of the children, to the Master Bedroom for the Third Decade led by the father, to the girls' bedroom for the fourth Decade led by a daughter, and the boys' bedroom led by a son. The Concluding prayers and Litany of Loretto could be led by a teen.

Prayer Help from Holy Cross Family Ministries

To deepen the prayer experience consider using the newly released film PRAY, the story of Venerable Patrick Peyton. He pioneered the mission to inspire, foster and promote the prayer



life and spiritual well-being of families throughout the world. SHE WILL TAKE YOU THROUGH

We are blessed to have life once lived and experienced by our predecessors. Although the environment may change but essential aspects will always remain the same at all costs. When you are in a situation that someone once managed to maneuver through, you will always run to that person for advice to means and solutions to the challenges.

In the same way, Mother Mary will take us through family challenges and joys we experience every now and then:

- Luke 1:26-38. As Angel Gabriel was about to share the good news to Mary for the salvation of the world, Mary *listened* to what the angel was saying *presented her worries* and the angel explained to her, then she made a final decision *Yes* that led to the salvation of the world. In our families we need to have an ear that listens to God's message, take God through or challenges and then make a final decision according to God's will. We sometimes make wrong decision because we listen to wrong people.


Turn to the Lord in prayer and let you *Yes* be a foundation for the salvation of your family, children and dependents.

- Luke 1:46-56. Mary expresses her joy in the mercy of the Lord. For anything good in our families, glory always should be given to God. This Cantic of Mary, expresses how God raised her from *lowliness* to the point of *all generations calling her Blessed*.

- Matthew 2:13-17. Many of our children are targets for harm. Many unborn are in danger of death by the jealous

people, through abortion and charm. Mary intercedes for parents whose children are in the danger of death. As she protected Jesus Herod, she is ready to help our families protected from malicious acts on our children. In 1531, Mary appeared to St. Juan Diego as Our Lady of Guadalupe. She left her image imprinted on his Tilma. The image clearly shows she is *pregnant*. She wears the black band around her waist that Aztec women wore when they were pregnant. She revealed herself as the mother of Christ and the mother of the Mexican people. She helped them break the bond of a false religion which involved the abominable practice of human sacrifice. Now we turn to Mary, under her title of Our Lady of Guadalupe to ask her to intercede again to break the bond of the culture of death in our society and especially to protect unborn babies in the womb.

- When the very essence of marriage between a man and woman is under attack and we find many that some propose the so-called marriage between persons of the same sex, we ask the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary to defend marriage as God designed it. We ask her intercession as the Seat of Wisdom to be able to help us teach and defend the true nature of marriage in a clear and precise way so that we will be well understood by all persons of good will.
- Luke 2:41-52. It is a challenge in our families still that children are lost from our reach, this has many unruly and rather disobedient, not only to the parents but to the world. Parents are the primary teachers of children in *all* aspects of life. As Jesus was found and He moved back home with His parents, **he advanced in wisdom and age and favour before God and man.** Let us invoke Mary's intercession for our lost children.




Not only lost in physical presence but also in morals, spiritual aspects and human behaviors.

In the protection of the Blessed Virgin we place our total confidence and hope. Inspired by the *Memorare* of St. Bernard we express our assurance that if we seek her protection, implore her help and pray for her intercession we will never be left unaided.



The Story of Venerable PATRICK PEYTON

Fr. Peyton was born **January 9, 1909** in County Mayo, Ireland, and for 51 years he dedicated his life as a Holy Cross priest to Mary, the Mother of God. He is known as the “**Rosary Priest**” who tirelessly promoted the powerful prayer of the Rosary.

Across the globe, many of his Rosary Rallies attracted hundreds of thousands, including a gathering in Manila with over a million people in attendance.

At the time of his death he had preached to more people in person than any other Catholic. It was he who first proclaimed the phrases

*“The family that prays together stays together”
and “A world at prayer is a world at peace”.*

Fr. Peyton’s faith was first nourished in the family. Both he and his brother Tom, who also became a Holy Cross priest, were dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus by their father and entrusted to the care of Our Lady by their mother when they departed Ireland for America. Only later as a seminarian did Peyton discover the providential truth that all Holy Cross priests are dedicated to the Sacred Heart.

He writes: *“Not in our wildest imaginings did my parents or my brother or I dream what Our Lord had in store for us in America. He called my brother to the priesthood from the coalmines of Scranton. He called me from being the janitor in St. Peter’s Cathedral. In the fall of 1929, we entered the seminary at Notre Dame, Indiana. There, we continued the family Rosary with our new family, the priests and our fellow seminarians”* (All For Her: The Autobiography of Father Patrick Peyton, CSC).

After a miraculous healing from tuberculosis that he attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Mother, Fr. Peyton dedicated himself to spreading the practice of the family rosary. Divine Providence had great plans for Fr. Peyton and he responded with zeal for the work!

He was a pioneer in harnessing the power of the media for service to the Gospel.

His Rosary Rallies were broadcasted around the world via radio. He convinced celebrities such as Bing Crosby, Grace Kelly, and Raymond Burr to lend their fame to the promotion of the rosary through radio, television, and film.

Fr. Peyton understood naturally what it means to be a man with hope to bring.

He laboured with the rich and the poor, the famous and the ignored, to promote prayer in our world. This continues today through [Holy Cross Family Ministries](#) which includes [Family Rosary](#) and [Family Theater Productions](#).

Fr. Peyton died on June 3, 1992, at 83 years old. His final words were: “Mary, my Queen, my Mother.”

In June of 2001 the formal Cause of Canonization was introduced at the Vatican and on December 18, 2017, Pope Francis declared Fr. Peyton Venerable, the second of the four stages to Sainthood. The next stage will require a miracle to be officially attributed to him. His priestly example engenders in us the desire to be loyal sons of Our Lady, seeking her motherly intercession as we are prayerfully attentive to the needs of our Church and our world. Work continues on Fr. Peyton’s cause through the Archdiocese of Baltimore.




History and Pope Francis have infused these three words with layers of significance. Francis declared this the year of Joseph! March is the month of Joseph, and on March 19th we keep a solemn festival in honor of Joseph.

This is not your average Joe. He follows the Patriarch Joseph sold into slavery by his jealous brothers. Joseph attracts the attention of Egypt's Pharaoh because he interprets dreams accurately. This leads to his becoming the Chief Minister of the King. In this capacity he stores up grain against the coming famine.

When Joseph's brothers come to Pharaoh seeking grain to avoid starvation, the King says, "Go to Joseph." It all ends well when Joseph forgives them and embraces them saying, "I am Joseph, your Brother."

But the Joseph we honor today stands apart from all others. The Eternal Father chooses him out of all men of every age and place to be the Guardian, Protector and Earthly Foster Father of the Lord Jesus. What a singular mission and responsibility!

Like the earlier Joseph, this Joseph trades in dreams. But he is not an idle dreamer. Joseph's



dreams come bearing God's challenging mission not only to protect, guard, rear, educate, train, provide for and love Jesus; but also to be the loving husband of Mary, the Mother of God, and to be the head of the household of the Holy Family.

By tradition, we invoke him as the model of laborers, protector of the Church, patron of the suffering, hope of the sick, patron of the dying.

But here is what I really hope to share with you. Joseph is a model of how to love generously, humanly, fully.

Pope Francis says the chastity of St. Joseph is "The summation of an attitude that is the opposite of possessiveness. **Chastity is freedom from possessiveness in every sphere of life.**

Only when love is chaste is it truly love.... He never made himself the center of things. He did not think of himself; but focused instead on Mary and Jesus." Pope Francis reminds us that "fathers are not born but made. A man does not become a father simply by bringing a child into the world, but by taking up the responsibility to care for that child. Whenever a man takes responsibility for the life of another, in some way he becomes a father to that person." {*Patris Corde*}

The name "Joseph" means "increase." His fatherhood was directed totally to helping Jesus grow according to his humanity, and Joseph wants to help Jesus grow in all of us. The sure path to making that happen is through growing in devotion to St. Joseph, since Joseph's whole life points to Jesus. So, Friends, Go to Joseph! You won't regret it. ITE AD JOSEPH!

KEEPING FAITH IN GOD amidst daily Challenges in Families


When one reads the letter to the Hebrews, especially chapters 6, 7 and 11 the writer encourages the Christian community to have faith in God amidst any challenges of life. He affirms that “Faith can guarantee the blessings that we hope for or even prove the existence of realities that are unseen” (Heb. 11:1).

Faith is the substance of things hoped for, and the evidence of things unseen. It is therefore clear from this encouragement that it is impossible to accomplish or realize anything or blessing without Faith. If it is true to say that “The family that prays together, stays together”, then indeed it is appropriate to state that the family that believes together, also stays together! From this progression, we can infer that indeed in a family common Faith inspires common prayer which in turn inspires communion of life! By extension therefore, the family that prays together, stays together and believes together.

In this article, the emphasis is laid on Faith in God as the master of all creation, wonderful counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, the prince of Peace (Is. 9:6). It focuses on faith in God as the source of all

consolation and comfort. Faith is key in finding consolation in family challenges. But how can we poor and wretched souls who are earth bound keep faith in God amidst various contemporary family challenges?

These challenges may include: lack of education, lack of food, lack of shelter, marital dysfunctionality, marital Conflict, family Misunderstandings, Gossip, Lying, Theft, Rumor mongering, Birth of unprepared-for babies, Death, Sickness, Quarrels, sexual and moral Abuses, marital promiscuity, jealousy and envy, human disguise, forms of indignation, relationship breakups, loss of job, situations of defamation, lack of acceptance, family neglect, forced early marriages, early pregnancies, social isolation, rejections and separations based on culture, race and color; heart breaks and loss of beloved one to calamities of life like diseases and other sicknesses and finally, suicide.



These and other challenges may inspire a member of a given family to doubt the presence of God thereby leading to despair and even, to the worst state, loss of love and loneliness! Yet though it is part of human history to experience these moments and their effects in the family, St. Paul while writing to the Thessalonians, exhorts us saying “you brethren are not in darkness for this day (these moments) to take you like a thief” (Thes. 5:4).

Therefore, as Christians, we ought to anchor our faith in God. For Jesus tells us that, “Consider the ravens: They do not sow or reap, they have no storehouse or barn; yet God feeds them. How much more valuable you are than the birds! Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life? So if you cannot do such a small thing, why do you worry about the rest? (Lk. 12:24-26). We ought to learn to Trust in God amidst all these moments because he cares.

What shall help us along this path of faith in God? I would like to suggest the following ways to help us keep our faith anchored in God: Attend the Holy Mass and if possible share in the body and blood of Christ, have frequent reception of the sacrament of confession – there is a lot of healing and restoration to the harmony searched for; have a reliable spiritual director to encourage you on the path of faith matters; join a faith community at your church (it can be a Patrick Peyton Guild or a Small Christian Community or a lay apostolic community); do not miss out on weekly adoration



of the Blessed Sacrament there is more power in the activity without measure.

Finally, I would like to encourage the reader to develop a habit of praying the Most Holy Rosary while seeking intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The meditation on the mysteries of the life, passion, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ and the life of Mary may and will always lead us to a deeper relationship with God and enhance our faith in God.

We can master and keep a stable sense of faith in God amidst all the challenges. And indeed, we need to always believe that God is always faithful even when we are at a loss, weak and unfaithful on our faith journey. Therefore, trust in Him always, there will not be any regrets.

- Improves communication where relationships are broken.
- In case of dejection & rejection, it will improve self-image.
- Helps one acquire the ability to change those self-defeating habits
- Builds the endurance and understanding one needs to relate and bear with different personalities.

So please don't give up on life and relationships, count on God and one reliable friend - Counseling & Prayer will make your life worth living again, give it a trial.

HISTORY



HOLY CROSS FAMILY MINISTRIES, EAST AFRICA


The beginnings of Holy Cross Family Ministries in East Africa can be traced to the visit of Venerable Father Patrick Peyton, CSC in 1955 in East Africa where he conducted several Rosary Crusades around the country.

There were rallies in Nakivubo Kampala, Butare in Bushenyi, Virika Fort Portal, and other parts of East Africa such as Nairobi Kenya. There are several people and religious who attended the rallies and still speak highly of the experience and the holiness of Father Patrick Peyton.

Arriving in 1955 in East Africa, Father Patrick Peyton in essence was the first missionary of the Congregation of Holy Cross to set foot in East Africa. Father Peyton later visited Nairobi in the 1990s at the invitation of Servant of God Cardinal Maurice Otunga the then archbishop of Nairobi who wrote to Father Peyton asking Father Peyton to establish a family prayer ministry in East Africa. This was not to happen until many years later.

Close to five years after the death of Father Peyton who belonged to the Eastern Province of the Congregation of Holy Cross, the then Provincial Superior of the Eastern Province Father Hugh Cleary visited East Africa that was under the leadership of Father George Lucas who was a member of the Eastern Province.

Cleary was Fr. John Phalen, CSC who was the incoming President of Holy Cross Family Ministries. Fr John Phalen came to look into the possibility of expanding the work of Holy Cross Family Ministries to other parts of the world especially in areas where Holy Cross was present.

Fr Phalen's vision was that the growth of Holy Cross Family Ministries was tied to the Congregation of Holy Cross. The presence of the Congregation in the different parts of the world would not only provide leadership but it would also provide needed connections to spread to other parts of the world. Holy Cross religious needed to get involved.

Father George Lucas assigned Father James Rahilly as the first director of the ministry in East Africa who did the ministry part time. A house was rented in Southlands Langata as the operational base of the ministry. Some printed material that introduced the


ministry and prayer cards in Swahili were produced during the time of James Rahilly. When James Rahilly was appointed as the director of the Holy Cross Mission Center at Notre Dame, the ministry was assigned to Fr Neil Ryan, CSC who lived in Fort Portal. Neil Ryan who was a popular sports coach and developer in Uganda divided his time between family prayer ministry and sports work in Uganda. Ryan's time so increased printing of promotional materials such as prayer cards and the beginning of the showing to groups of films that were produced by Holy Cross Family Ministries such as the Mysteries of the Rosaries.

When Father Ryan was transferred to Holy Cross Parish Dandora, the ministry was assigned to Father William Blum who was a lecturer at St Paul's National Seminary Kinyamasika Fort Portal.

Fr. Blum also had experience working with Marriage Encounter and he incorporated that within Holy Cross Family Ministries. At the opening of the first private FM radio station in Fort Portal and the whole Uganda –The Voice of Toro-- Fr Blum saw an opportunity to introduce faith programs on the air. Different groups were recorded praying the rosary and the programs broadcast every night before people retired to bed. Later Sunday reflections were added to the rosary programs to prepare people for Sunday mass. Priests preached on the Sunday readings and the homilies were run in the morning. At this time there were no permanent staff and Fr Blum relied on different people. One group that was popular on air

with the rosary was the prisoners of Katojo prison. The prayers of the prisoners moved other listeners who saw something deeper and beautiful in the lives of the prisoners beyond their life as prisoners. The family prayer ministry owned a computer, a printer, and a recording machine and some funds to help pay basic stipends and gasoline.

When Father Blum was sent to Holy Cross Parish Kitete Tanzania, Father Fulgens Katende was assigned as the new director. Fr Katende was



made a full time director with no other ministry given to him. He built onto the prior efforts of other Holy Cross religious that had worked in the ministry before him. Whereas situated in Kampala Uganda, Father Katende started working on establishing of teams of evangelizers within the different regions where Holy Cross is present. In Fort Portal he rented space in McCauley Hall near Virika for the team that would continue with the work of radio programs on Voice of Toro. In Kampala he had a team of different lay people trained in family life and

prayer who started producing radio programs on the Catholic-run Radio Sapientia. In Jinja he started a team that ran programs on Radio Empanga in Kamuli. Meanwhile in Nairobi Kenya he began programs on Radio Waumini run by the Catholic bishops of Kenya. Working with different lay teams, Father Katende also connected with different bishops and priests in different dioceses where the ministry did not have offices but regularly ran programs especially for married couples.

To include more Holy Cross religious in the ministry, Father Katende suggested to the District Council of Holy Cross in East Africa to assign a young Holy Cross religious for the pastoral year with Holy Cross Family Ministries in Fort Portal. Fred Jenga, CSC was the first young seminarian to be assigned in Fort Portal to work with Holy Cross Family Ministries. As the ministry expanded in the different parts of East Africa where Holy Cross is present, the tradition of assigning Holy Cross religious to regional offices of Holy Cross Family Ministries was continued and it has come with tremendous benefit to the ministry.

It was also during the time of Father Katende that the printing of promotional materials increased such as T-shirts, prayer cards, and calendars. It was during the same time that the "Try Prayer Contest" writing, art, and poetry contests for students were started in East Africa. Whereas the number of entries was small, teachers and

school chaplains came to know the contest and the numbers grew over time.

When Father Katende was assigned to be the director of Holy Cross formation program in Jinja Uganda, Father Fred Jenga was asked to run the ministry. Building on the efforts of his predecessors Father Jenga expanded the ministry in many ways. He established full time lay teams and offices in all the regions where Holy Cross is present and facilitated the teams with resources to promote the ministry in the different regions.

Each region had a Holy Cross religious as “regional coordinator” of the ministry who worked hand in hand with the lay teams. More radio programs were produced and effort on “outreach” in parishes and institutions was amplified. The ministry focused on the pillars of Faith, Prayer, Family/Marriage. Elements that defined Father Peyton’s work such as prayer rallies, retreats, and an extensive use of the mass media like radio, television and other digital forms were incorporated into the ministry.

Holy Cross Family Ministries came to be known for its creative and spiritually enriching programs for couples, the youth and children. The children’s rosary rallies were introduced in different regions, and the Try Prayer Contests exponentially grew; and so, did the number

of promotional materials such as calendars, t-shirts, caps, prayer cards. An online spiritual program was introduced that made available spiritually enriching material to Catholics who were looking for spiritually inspiring material. All the offices in Uganda had fulltime means of transport for outreach and arrangements were made to get greater facilitation for young offices in Nairobi and Kitete Tanzania. It was also during this time that radio programs were started in Tanzania on Radio Habari Njema run by the diocese of Mbulu.

It was also during this time that the ministry was registered as a legal entity in Uganda that could own property and enter into agreements. A two-tiered board was also established with the lower board including Catholics with expertise in media, law, business, etc and the upper board exclusively for Holy Cross religious that would ensure faithful protection of the mission of the ministry. It was also during this time that local Peyton Prayer Guilds were started in Kampala, Jinja, and Nairobi. And at the same time effort was made to build Holy Cross Family Ministries’ owned recording studios for ease of work. Recording equipment and spaces were created and training done to set the project on course.

Hundreds of young people used to attend the Try Prayer

Contests in the different regions, and hundreds more attended the annual regional Children’s Rosary Rallies that came with marching bands in the different regions. Married couples’ conferences and rallies were also made especially on the feast of the Holy Family in December and the International Day of the Family in May. The Archbishop of Kampala eventually asked Fr Jenga to coordinate other family life movements in the Archdiocese of Kampala which helped to focus the different groups to the needs of families in the Archdiocese of Kampala.

The showing of films and the possession of a live gospel band that had young people passionate about sharing the message of Christ especially about the power of prayer made Holy Cross Family Ministries a sought-after Catholic group for spiritually enriching programs for different groups.

More connections were established with bishops, priests and other lay groups that focused on deepening faith, prayer, and strengthening family/marriage life.

This year, 2021, we made 10 years in marriage and our



able to react appropriately to them without causing damage to our relationship.


Having support groups has helped us to be grounded and to know that our challenges are not unique to us. We also have accountability partners who keep us in check, they have really helped us to stay focused.

Working with Holy Cross Family Ministries is giving us the opportunity to reach out to other couples, inspire them and strengthen them.



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


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
